Manuscripts should be clearly typed, double-spaced, and follow the format of volume II. Illustrations should be A4 (210 x 297 mm) for reduction to A5 (148 x 210 mm). ARC has a policy of the non-sexist use of language and contributors are requested to conform to this policy. The editors are most willing to assist with any enquiries which may arise on this point.

ARC retains the copyright on all material it prints, but reproduction and publication rights are granted to authors on request.
