On 195^b in red the xvcent. inscription This is the boke
off S' Will' Trar I witnessse where for I Thomas Barcyle (?)
havyng knowlage there off have putt to my signe

This is the boke Ser Robert Hawe (xvi), and other scribbles
has the Moore bookplate, under which was found a
fragment of a document (c. A.D. 1300) relating to Norwich
and Sedgeford (now Doc. 799)
