Art. 1 has gold and blue paragraph marks, capitals in gold well flourished in blue, initial and full-page border of conventional foliage on pp. 1 and 4, and an initial and partial border to every Part except no. 2; the rest have capitals in red and blue ~~and~~, and no illumination. pp. 272-73 (5) [JOHN LYDGATE, The Kings of England sithen William Conqueror] This myghti
Wylyam duke of Normandy — in his right Amen. P. 274 is blank.
Added in a large hand, without rubrication. IMEV no. 3632; it is stanzas 16-30
of the text printed in H. N. MacGracken, Minor Poems of J. L. II (EETS vol. 192, 1934) pp. 710-16.

pp. 275-361 (6) [WALTER HILTON, Scale ^{of} Perfection, part one] Gostly syster in Item
Crist I preye ye yat in ye kalling — state of life contemplatiif. Ye grace
of oure Lord Ihesu Crist be with ye and with him yat writes yis boke. Amen.
A list of titles of the 91 chapters precedes (pp. 275-78).

At the foot of p. 361, another hand has added 28 Latin hexameter lines, dealing in the

Written for a person of quality, to judge by the appearance of the book, but the three
escutcheons provided in the border on p. 190 were unfortunately left blank. At the
foot of every page from 275 on, an early hand has added, between scrolls, the figure
20 and a monogram, apparently br. At the foot of 36 is a pencil scribble Dan
Adam... ; on 274 (xv/xvi cent.) Cardinalis Cen... ; also Thomas
~~Myrlay~~... ; at the top of 275 a long erasure.

Inside the front cover are early XIX cent. notes on the contents (one ascribing them to 'Robert
Rolle of Hampole' is said to be by Faulder.), and the signature C.W.Williams Wynn.
He took the catalogue of the Wynn sale at Sotheby's 5 February 1851. Subsequently
in the library of Lord Ashburnham, Appendix cxl, and is described in the third volume
of his privately printed catalogue [1864]. Lot 174 in the Ashburnham sale at Sotheby's,
1 May 1899 ; acquired by A.W. Young, who presented it to the Library in 1933.
