The leaves at the end (278-300), in another hand, are a collection of Biblical passages, in 5 books of 3 and 4 columns, under many rubrics mostly concerned with virtues and vices, beginning in perfect on Gula to which are prefixed the verses Naturam ledit primogenitum quoque vendit — and ending in perfect with the Last Things
