The decoration is very copious; besides that described above, there are framed borders mainly on grounds of fluid gold, but sometimes purple, blue, pink, or grey, with realistic flowers (violet, pink, columbine, rose, sweet-pea, iris, heartsease, strawberry, etc.), birds (peacock, pheasant, etc.), insects (butterfly, dragonfly, caterpillar, snail, etc.), and grotesques. There are full borders to all full page pictures, on the pages facing them, and in the Kalendar. Minor services have three-sided borders. The miniature of the Nativity (71^b) by Gerard David; the borders and all other miniatures by the so-called Master of the Prayer Books Vide Flemish Art, 1300-1700 (Royal Acad. of Arts Winter Exhibition, 1953-4), no. 607

In the Kalendar the zodiacal sign is in the form of a medallion in the top right hand corner of the border; the occupation in an oblong picture at the foot

43^b. Matins of the Virgin. Annunciation: Angel with sceptre, L;
the Virgin kneels by a desk under a red curtained canopy;
clock hanging on wall, chandelier from ceiling

60^b. Lauds. Visitation in yard before a house; gate as in the
Kalendar pictures; house of brick, and half timbered;
leafless trees

71^b. Prime. Nativity: the Virgin and Joseph adore the Child
lying nude in manger; shepherds look in; angels hover in
sky

76^b. Tierce. Two shepherds, one with bagpipe, and woman
spinning in fenced field; dog in foreground; angel in sky,
the words *Gloria - hominibus* written in gold proceed from
his hand. Landscape with cottage; one tree leafless, the
others green; gates as before

85^b. None. Presentation, in a stately church. Symeon mitred,
under a green canopy, L has linen draped over his hands;
the Child is nude; the Virgin, Joseph, maid and a deacon
are present; two gilt figures in background

90^b. Vespers. Flight into Egypt: rocky landscape, budding trees,
river, and towered building

98^b. Compline. Massacre of Innocents: two soldiers and two

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mothers in fenced yard by houses; gate as before

111. John, Baptist with lamb

111.^b Paul resting hands on hilt of sword, Peter holding key and open book.

112. Sebastian bound to tree; one archer

112.^b Nicholas martyred, holding crozier; 3 nude figures, L

113. Francis receives the stigmata; red scaphic crucifix in sky

113.^b Katherine seated, holding sword in left hand, and turning pages of book, lying on her lap, with her right

114. Barbara reading, holding palm; tower, L

115.^b Mass of St Gregory, in a fine church. Two cardinals and a server attend; Christ stands in tomb over the altar, with part of a circle of angels about him; the cross, lance, column, spear and scourges are to be seen.

117. In text: Bernard in white habit holding crozier and open book; the devil lies immediately behind him.

118.^b In text: Athanasius, full face, throned as bishop, with crozier and open book

122.^b Seven Penitential Psalms. David in crimson red robe prays in landscape of trees and castle on rock; gate as before; his crown and harp lie before him; angel in cloud with three darts

142.^b Offree of the Dead. Raising of Lazarus who steps out of grave; Christ in purple, three Apostles and Mary; three Jews, two of whom hold their noses, a short distance away; buildings and street in background

181.^b Betrayal, with Peter wounding Malchus, L; Judas has red cloak covering his hand; crowd of soldiers; rocks in background

186.^b Scourging, L; crowning with thorns in building, L

189.^b Bearing the Cross: man drags Christ by rope round his

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wrist; others strike him

190^b: Nailing to the Cross: man pulls at a rope about the feet; horsemen in distance

193^b: Deposition: Joseph and Nicodemus take the body down; the Virgin seated, z with John behind her

194^{bis}: Stabat Mater. Christ on the Cross; the Virgin kneels, L; John, weeping, z; rocky hills in background

Traditionally known as the Hours of Isabella of Aragon, but apparently not written specially for her. It is said to have been in her possession in 1500 or 1501 (?) when sent to Isabella of Castile through her ambassador Antonio de Cardona from Gran (Strigonia) in Hungary (vide the holograph letter to Isabella of Castile: Add. 4100²). The book contains no heraldry, and the suppliant in the prayers Obsecro te (37^b) and Intemerata (40^b) is male; on the other hand there is the rubric in Spanish (196^{bis})

On 206^b, in gold letters, the border inscription NSMO:
