Circa A.D. 1400 in clear, round hands, with later additions; headings in red, paragraph marks in red or blue, capitals alternately in red and blue, and blue initial capitals with conventional foliage filling, and flourishing in red. On 17, 28 and 34 initials in gold and colour, with partial borders of foliage, diapered with white. For the ornament, see below.

On 27^b a full page picture of the Crucifixion, with Mary and John. The ground of the cross is gold, with side panels of latticed purple and blue respectively. Christ wears the Crown of Thorns with a blue nimbus, outlined in black and diapered with white. Mary, orange nimbus, wears a full length blue cloak, lined orange, diapered with white dots arranged in threes, over a purple gown; black shoes. John, purple nimbus, wears an orange cloak, lined green, diapered with white dots in the form of rosettes, over a slate blue gown; he holds a book in the left hand. In the lower margin a floreated cross, and in the others sprays of foliage, all in gold and colour

On 2 in the hand of Sir Augustus Foster the, pencilled inscription 'given to me by Rev. Mr Pready, 1820' 1^b. The name of C. H. Foster (xix) Acquired from S. Chisenhale Marsh by Francis Jenkinson, Librarian, 10 March 1890 and presented by him 31 December 1891

BML 837 suggests 'perhaps from Farleigh' (Cluniac Priory of Monkton Farleigh, Wilts., Cell to Lewes Priory); M.R.J. incline to guess, from the importance of the Translation of St Andrew (May 9), that the book may be from St Andrew's Priory at Northampton
