Vellum, $23 \times 15\frac{1}{2}$ in., ii + 114 + ii ff (1-71 and 100-109 numbered) in Roman figures in red (by the scribe on the verso), single column, 6 lines of text and the same number of 4 line staves of music in red to a page. Mid. to late xv cent. Large gothic hand, with headings in red, and initials alternately in red and blue with mauve and red flourishing respectively. Each Mass has a large initial in green, carmine, blue, red and orange diapered ^{with} in white or gold ground; other decoration, see below.

2 flyleaves. A¹⁰ B⁶ C - D⁸ P². 2 flyleaves

Contemporary sheepskin, blind tooled, over massive oak boards to 5 bands, brass furnishings for double strap and pin fastening with ^{one of} the straps renewed in recent times; traces of bosses on both boards. A frame formed by triple fillets and similarly divided into triangular compartments.

In addition to the decoration described above, there are the following historiated subjects: —

1. Initial A: David kneels in landscape facing r, his crown on the ground before him; in the upper panel the

head and shoulders of the Deity, bearded, in the sky. A full border of sprays of conventional blue flowers and red and maniac quatrefoils decorated with gold.

50. Initial C: Half length figure of the Deity, bearded, blessing in a sky spangled with golden stars. Lower margin: A medallion of Christ, partly robed in white, standing with Resurrection banner on a tomb between the two Marys.

105. Initial N: ss Peter and Paul, bearded; the one holding keys, the other a sword and a book. The initials at 107^b and 109^b not filled in.
