On f. 101 [100] is a picture of the crucifixion, curiously rough, on an odd green ground	
with yellow flowering plants. Christ has the crown of thorns: three nails. The Virgin and	
John have strange cusped nimbi. The framed borders are of conventional English work	
with green pink blue.	
In the lower margin the cross, in the form of the Rood of Bromholm a double arm framed	
in gold. Fixed in a stone block. Blood flows from the hands.	
Proper of saints in the hand of ff. 24-63	160
On 168 is added in the margin a collect for St Felix (Apostle of East Anglia) Deus qui	
maximam clemenciam	
The hand changes on the same leaf	

On 201 ^b in margin De S. Thoma Herford ep. et conf. or. Deus qui ecclesiam tuam in <u>b</u> Thome Pontificis	
Common of saints & missae votivae	210
Hic inc. miraculum trigintalis S. Gregorii pope.	245 ^b
A long rubric of the mother of a pope guilty of unchastity & child murder whose ghost appeared to her son when celebrating & told him of the virtues of the heart etc.. The conclusion of the story is in a rubric on 246 ^b after the office	
Ordo ad seruicium peregrinorum faciendum	246 ^b
Added hymn. Hac clara die turonia (?) festiu dat preconia (annunciation)	
A mass of the Passion (?) humiliavit semetipsum	248 ^b
An erasure: same verse of psalm of the Passion added

The ornaments except probably the one picture already described seem all to be one hand.
It consists merely of initials in gold & colour to the principal feasts with partial borders in
green, pink, blue, orange-yellow.
