Parris 352 Holdsworth 120. At top of f. 1 rather cut is a xiv-xvth cent. inscription: anselmus de summo bono. cur deus homo. et quedam disputacio inter gentilem et christianum. vij^o. loco (Benedictine Abbey of St Werburg, Chester). I have seen this numbering elsewhere but cannot identify it. (It is in one of the Hatton [?] MSS in Bodley, preserved by Hatton [?] from some other place.)
